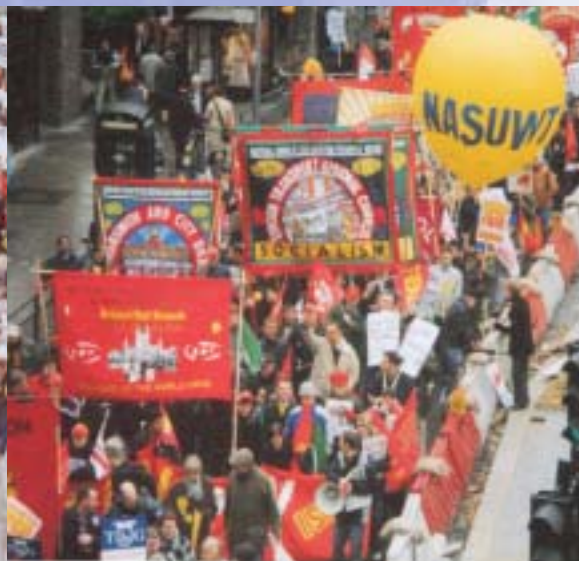
United for international solidarity.
